

Village of Pewaukee 2025 PROPERTY TAXES

General Information

Your entire real estate tax bill, or your first installment, is due by January 31, 2026. Failure to meet this deadline will result in the entire tax bill due and payable. Waukesha County mails your tax statement and collects your payment on behalf of the Village of Pewaukee, Waukesha County, Waukesha County Technical College, and Pewaukee School District.

Installment Plan Option

There is an option for a two-installment payment plan. Refer to your enclosed statement for the respective due dates and amounts for each of the installments. If an installment is delinquent, the total remaining unpaid tax becomes delinquent and interest and penalties are calculated back to February 1, 2025.

Tax Receipts

Receipts are automatically mailed for all payments made in December and January. If you are claiming your tax payment on your 2025 income tax return, your payment must be receipted or postmarked no later than December 31st, 2025. **Metered postage date is not accepted.**

Lottery Credit

Did you own and use your home as your primary residence on January 1, 2025? If so; then you qualify for the lottery credit. If your tax bill does not reflect the credit but you qualify, there is a form available on the Village of Pewaukee's website, under the [Treasurer's page](#).

Refund Checks

Checks will be mailed within 4-6 weeks from payment date. Waukesha County has established a policy of refunding amounts greater than \$2.00.

Payment convenience fees will apply:

- \$1.50 for eCheck
- \$3.95 for debit card
- 2.59% for credit card payments

Dropbox

For your convenience, a 24-hour drop box is available. It is the blue and white night deposit box located on the east side of Waukesha County Courthouse, facing Pewaukee Road, on the island near the blue postal box.

Any payment deposited into the box by 7:30 AM will be dated for the previous day.

Each property tax payment is distributed to Pewaukee School District, Village of Pewaukee, Waukesha County, and Waukesha County Technical College.

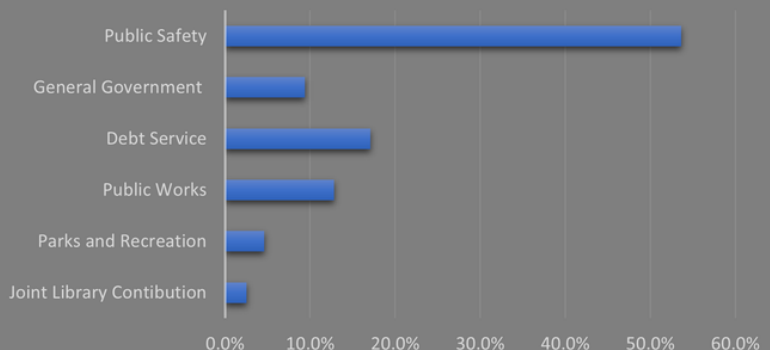
What Does the Village's Portion of Tax Allocation Provide to its Residents?

Village Recycling Center

The Village recycling center is located at 552 Hickory St.

It is open on Wednesday's 3:30 PM to 7:30 PM (May 6th to September 23rd) and Saturday's 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM (March 28th to December 5th). A tag is required to utilize this service for yard waste. Upcoming Elections

Spring Elections are for non-partisan offices.

- If a Primary if necessary, it is held on the 3rd Tuesday in February.
- The Spring Election is held on the 1st Tuesday in April.

Non-partisan offices include:

- **Local:** Village President, Trustees, Municipal Judge and School Board Members
- **County:** County Board Supervisor, Multi-Jurisdictional Judge, County Executive, County Advisory Referendum if applicable
- **State:** State Superintendent of Public Instruction, Justice of the Supreme Court, Circuit Court Judge, Court of Appeals Judge, Statewide Referendum if applicable

Snow & Ice Removal

Snow and ice must be removed from sidewalks and public pedestrian ways within 24 hours after snowfall or occurrence causing formation of snow and ice per Village Code. The Village reserves the right to remove snow and ice and to impose charges for removal. Snow is not to be placed on any public sidewalk, street or right-of-way in the Village.
