# PEWAUKEE LAKE ADVISORY COMMITTEE MINUTES OCTOBER 6, 2022 @ 6:00 PM

First order of business: Call to Order

Town of Delafield Supervisor Woelfle called the meeting to order at 6:03 p.m.

Second order of business: Pledge of Allegiance; Moment of Silence

Third order of business: Roll Call

Present: Ian Clark, Timothy Heier, Ed Hill, Sgt. Twelmeyer, Joe Woelfle, and Dan Green.

Fourth order of business: Citizen Comments: None

Fifth order of business: Introduction of Pewaukee Lake Water Ski Show Team:

Bill Miston, secretary of the Pewaukee Lake Water Club, spoke about the growth of their program which has been around for 37 years. Their program is great for people coming to the lake for the first time, and they are expecting growth in the coming season. Ed Hill asked if any jumps that were being added would be permanent, or in and out, and stored on the lake front. Mr. Miston explained that the jump had not been purchased yet, but they are looking at a variety of options.

Sgt. Twelmeyer stated he is familiar with the tow boat driver safety program. He asked what it takes to be a tow boat driver in the show. Mr. Miston explained to be certified, there are certain benchmarks that have to be met. A number of tests include different types of skiers and acts to tow. Tests are administered by chief drivers of the governing body. They have 7 or 8 people who are safety certified. Once you receive your learners permit, you have to do a motor vehicle background check. If anything comes up, they are instantly out of the program. Drivers are required to put in ten hours a year to keep their certificate.

Sixth order of Business: Approval of Minutes from February 23, 2022:

Motion by Ed Hill to approve the minutes from February 23, 2022. Seconded by Ian Clerk. Motion passed unanimously.

Seventh order of Business: Citizens Comments: None

#### **Eighth order of Business:** New Business:

a. Discussion and possible action on the 2023 Lake Patrol Budget

Sgt. Twelmeyer explained he would like to purchase a UTV for special events. The current ATVs were purchased in 2002 and 2005. They worked great when they were new, but as they get older they require more maintenance and more money. The UTV would work better in patrolling winter ice. He also explained that two officers can go out on patrol in one vehicle as opposed to two vehicles with one on each. They can also put more equipment on it. The total cost of the UTV would be \$20,000. He proposed using \$16,000 from fund balance, and would ask the communities to split the difference from the remaining.

Motion by Ed Hill to approve the budget as presented. Seconded by Ian Clark. Motion passed unanimously.

b. Discussion and possible action on the purchase of a new UTV.

Motion by Ian Clark to approve the purchase of a new UTV. Seconded by Ed Hill. Motion passed unanimously.

Discussion on Equipment Updates, including body cameras for Lake Officers.

Sgt. Twelmeyer stated he applied for a buoy grant, because they were significantly short. They ended up purchases 18 slow no wakes, hazard, and damn buoys. They spent \$8,700 in buoys. The grant covered half of that purchase. This year all the hazard buoys were in good shape and only lost 3 buoys. They have a good partnership with the barge and should result in much less purchase of buoys in the future. Total cost for in and out for buoys was around \$8,000.

The boat at 347 Park Ave has been donated to us. This summer the new boat and the one with a new motor cycle out monthly. All motors are stabled and when one is at launch the other is at inside storage.

Sgt. Twelmeyer explained there is a street in the Village of Pewaukee called Lake Street, and there was some thought about putting a pier there. The park and rec department is willing to let us use it. It would be up to us to put a boat lift at the end. This would be for boat storage for us to use. The antique boat show donated their pier section at a reasonable cost. There would have enough section for a 36-foot-long pier. They would have to get out there quite a ways to get in a safe location. If the lake patrol is out and there is an accident and the Fire Department has to make a rescue, they'd have to go to Clark street.

Sgt. Twelmeyer stated they are potentially applying for a grant for body cameras. Village of Pewaukee officers use them. The grant has a 50% reimbursement. The Lake Patrol as a whole would be responsible. He explained that they would look to purchase 5 or 6 body cameras. Heier stated that five would be adequate and that a 50% reimbursement rate is a great opportunity.

The board agreed to apply for the grant and put this item back on the agenda for February.

#### d. Discussion on Season Updates

Sgt. Twelmeyer explained that April 30<sup>th</sup> is spring training. Both boats have an AED and med bags, and tactical emergency casualty care. A member of the fire department came out to show everyone how to use the new med bags and the AED. Twenty-five students took part in a boater safety class. LCFR met with lake patrol to learn what their capabilities were, and what equipment they have. Sgt. Twelmeyer dropped off ordinance books at town and village halls along with all the bars and taverns on the lake. They are blaze orange so they are easily seen. He mentioned his monthly updates that have thorough information on activity on the lake. There were no injuries on the lake beyond first aid.

Dan Green stated that some of the Town Board members were interested in seeing the number of citations that were written for slow, no wake violations. Sgt. Twelmeyer stated they are part of the monthly reports and would send those over.

#### e. Recognition of Sgt. Sutter Retirement

Sgt. Twelmeyer explained that Sgt. Sutter is a retired Wauwatosa police captain, and has been a mentor to him. He is a great guy, and he is sad to see him retire.

f. Discussion and possible action on replacing the open sergeant position.

The intent is to replace Sgt. Sutter's position, and recommends Mellissa Schmit.

g. Discussion and possible action on hiring an additional officer.

Currently patrol has ten officers. Sgt. Twelmeyer recommends hiring an 11<sup>th</sup> officer. They have had upwards of 13 officers in the past. He explained that law enforcement candidates have been dwindling.

Motion by Ian Clark to approve the hiring of an 11<sup>th</sup> officer with no fiscal impact. Seconded by Ed Hill. Motion passed unanimously.

Ninth order of Business: Schedule next meeting as needed:
