VILLAGE BOARD MINUTES
April 5, 2023**

1. Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, Moment of Silence, and Roll Call

President Knutson called the meeting to order at approximately 6:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited, followed by a moment of silence.

Roll Call was taken with the following Village Board members present: Trustee Ed Hill, Trustee Bob Rohde, Trustee Kelli Belt, Trustee Chris Krasovich, Trustee Jim Grabowski; Trustee Craig Roberts; and President Jeff Knutson.

Also Present: Village Attorney, Mark Blum; Director of the Public Works Department, Dan Naze; Village Administrator, Scott Gosse; Village Clerk, Cassie Smith; and Chief of Police, Tim Heier.

2. Public Hearings/Presentations

- a. Ordinance No. 2023-02, Ordinance to Amend Section 40.471 of the Village Code of Village of Pewaukee Regarding the Regulation of Transient Commercial Lodging Uses in Residential Districts**

No comments were made.

3. Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting

- a. Minutes of the Regular Village Board Meeting – March 21, 2023**

Trustee Hill moved, seconded by Trustee Krasovich to approve the March 21, 2023, minutes of the Regular Village Board meeting as presented.

Motion carried 7-0.

4. Citizen Comments

Steve Rucci @ 161 W Wisconsin Ave. – Mr. Rucci spoke regarding the Village’s Liquor Licenses and asked for a waiting list to be created.

Sarah Stephens @ 161 W Wisconsin Ave - Ms. Stephens spoke about renting the two public parking spots outside her business. She asked for the same consideration as other businesses that rent spots for street dining so that she can have dedicated spots for her customers to pick up from her store.

5. Ordinances

- a. Possible Action on Ordinance No. 2023-02, Ordinance to Amend Section 40.471 of the Village Code of Village of Pewaukee Regarding the Regulation of Transient Commercial Lodging Uses in Residential Districts**

Administrator Gosse stated that this Ordinance was discussed at the Plan Commission for several months. The Plan Commission recommended the current code language to the Village Board on a 4-2 vote. The current code language is not compliant with State Statutes and the draft language would bring the code into compliance. The Plan Commission recommended a 3-night minimum, with rentals allowed 365 days per year, and an annual license.

Trustee Roberts stated this item was on the Plan Commission agenda for 3 months, and an agreement couldn’t be met. The proposed draft language was recommended to the Village Board with a 4-2 vote which demonstrates it

is not overall favored. State Statutes prevail until we have an ordinance that is compliant. The minimum stay can be 1-6 nights and we could place a limit on rentals from 180 – 365 days. Roberts stated he is opposed to the minimum night stay of 3 nights. He would like to ensure that rentals are not bachelor or bachelorette parties which would create a nuisance for neighbors, and he is concerned that the land use is not compatible with the surrounding area. He believes short-term rentals do not fit in with the neighborhood, businesses should not be able to operate within residential areas. He would be in favor of the minimum allowed nights at 6 nights.

Trustee Grabowski stated that the short-term rentals have already been operating in the Village and according to the Police Chief, no complaints have been made at these properties. This could also create another revenue stream if we collected occupancy tax which the Village currently loses each year. This money could help pay for events such as fireworks. There is a lot of speculation, but the evidence of issues is lacking.

Trustee Rohde asked for insight on how the Plan Commission arrived at the 3-night minimum. Roberts responded and stated that there were many differences of opinion and 4-6 days would be more of a family-oriented stay instead of a party on the weekend. Rohde stated that a mechanism to address compliance issues will be complicated and he would rather avoid the problems rather than react to them.

Trustee Hill stated that four emails were received by the Board from Melissa and Mark Schieble, Amanda Wegner, and Kimberly Hanan; all four individuals expressed their opposition to the ordinance and want restrictions to be as restrictive as possible. The City of Pewaukee and Town of Delafield adopted an ordinance regarding short-term rentals and they have a minimum stay of 6 nights. The draft ordinance speaks to requiring a minimum of 3 parking stalls which relates to the requirements within the current code.

Trustee Grabowski stated that the Village Board hasn't heard of any residents who live next to a short-term rental. His residence is close to a short-term rental, and it has been a great experience.

Trustee Belt agrees with Trustee Roberts. She supports the most restrictive terms. Short-term rentals are more prevalent on the lake. Residential areas should stay residential, and lodging is better suited in a commercial area, not in a residential area. She expressed concerns about future ownership of these properties due to the trend of corporations buying homes. Managers living within 5 miles are not local owners. This area is not a tourist town and she would like it to stay a residential lake community.

Trustee Krasovich stated that it is obvious that there is not a consensus among the residents therefore whichever way the Board votes someone will not be satisfied.

Trustee Rohde expressed that he is concerned that Kopmeier Dr, which will have a 6-night minimum on one side of the Road and a 3-night minimum on the other. He believes we should not be completely different on the same road and that property owners have the right to know their next-door neighbors.

Trustee Grabowski stated that there is no correlation between short-term renters and criminal activity so this is a moot point. Long-term renters are harder to remove than short-term renters.

President Knutson stated that the Town of Delafield and the City of Pewaukee have hotels in their community, but the Village does not. The draft ordinance requires licensing which gives the Village the ability to investigate or withhold a license if a property becomes problematic. He stated that the Village doesn't have to follow what other communities do. He would like the Village to be a destination for people to come to and enjoy therefore he is in favor of the 3-night minimum.

Trustee Grabowski moved, seconded by Trustee Krasovich to Approve Ordinance No. 2023-02 to Amend Section 40.471 of the Village Code of Village of Pewaukee Regarding the Regulation of Transient Commercial Lodging Uses in Residential Districts with the Update in Section 6(1)(e) to Reference ATCP 72.

Motion carried on roll call vote 4-3; Trustee Rohde, Belt and Roberts voted nay.

b. Possible Action on Ordinance No. 2023-03, Ordinance to Amend Chapter 86, Article III, Section 86.111 of the Code of Ordinances Regarding Speed Limits Decreased (W. Wisconsin Avenue along Lakefront Park)

Trustee Hill explained that this Ordinance was presented at the Public Works and Safety meeting on March 21st, 2023. This ordinance would change the speed limit to 15 mph year-round. Trustee Hill responded to Trustee Rohde; the Commission felt that the same issues were present in the winter months regarding blind-angled

parking and pedestrians crossing out of the crosswalks.

Trustee Krasovich moved, seconded by Trustee Roberts to Approve Ordinance No. 2023-03 to Amend Chapter 86, Article III, Section 86.111 of the Code of Ordinances Regarding Speed Limits Decreased (W. Wisconsin Avenue along Lakefront Park) as Presented.

Motion carried 7-0.

8. New Business

a. Discussion and Possible Action on Right-of-Way/Lease Agreement for Public Parking Spaces with Beach Bum Bakery, 161 W. Wisconsin Avenue, Unit 1G

Admin Gosse explained that Beach Bum Bakery submitted a request that was reviewed at the Public Works and Safety meeting on March 21st, 2023 which leases 2 parking spaces in front of the business for their customers only. The owner would like to rent the spaces from the Village just as other businesses do for dining. If approved the same terms and conditions as street dining rentals would be given. Gosse expressed that staff has discussed and enforcement is a concern due to the investigation time required if towing were to be utilized as a tool. Trustee Grabowski questioned the lease, if it is private could the rights be given to the leaser to enforce the parking? Attorney Blum spoke regarding the lease and stated that would be a policy decision but he would advise against allowing the business to tow vehicles at their discretion. Discussion followed regarding making 4 stalls 15-minute parking for all businesses and enforcement.

Trustee Krasovich moved, seconded by Trustee Grabowski to Approve the Right-of-Way/Lease Agreement for Public Parking Spaces with Beach Bum Bakery, 161 W. Wisconsin Avenue, Unit 1G as Presented.

Motion carried 6-1; Trustee Belt voting nay.

a. Discussion and Possible Action on Agreement with Flock Group Inc. for Hardware and Software License Plate Camera System

Admin Gosse stated that five Flock cameras cost \$15,000 for two years. The installation cost is \$1,750. The funds for the Flock cameras were approved using ARPA funds in the amount of \$15,000 but the cost of installation was omitted as the Department was not advised of the cost. Utilizing the operational budget to fund the installation can be done due to short staffing in the Police Department. This is a minimum 2 year agreement. Trustee Rohde stated that it is important to give the Police Department the best possible equipment to keep the community safe. Installation should begin within 6-9 weeks.

Trustee Hill moved, seconded by Trustee Rohde to Approve the Agreement with Flock Group Inc. for Hardware and Software License Plate Camera System in the Amount of \$15,000 Using ARPA Funds and an Additional \$1,750 for Installation Using the Operational Budget.

Motion carried 7-0.

a. Update on Finance Committee

Trustee Belt stated that she and Trustee Roberts met a few times to start framing the Finance Committee. The group has determined that a quarterly report will be presented at the second meeting of the month after the close of the quarter with Trustees Belt and Roberts reviewing monthly reports. Roberts stated that this will satisfy the strategic planning objective to create transparency of the Village’s finances. Belt stated that the Financial Dashboard has a goal to be completed by the end of September.

b. Discussion and Direction on Trustee Committee Appointment Terms

President Knutson asked for this item to be removed from this meeting.

c. Discussion and Direction on Proposed Building Code Amendment

Trustee Hill stated he would like to amend the Village ordinance regarding demolition. He would like the following to be added to the Ordinance language. “all hazardous and environmentally sensitive materials must be removed, contained and/or properly disposed of per current US EPA and WI DNR regulations with proper documentation submitted to Building Inspection Services. This includes and is not limited to; asbestos, lead based paint, florescent light bulbs, ballast, oil, and refrigerant.” The consensus of the Village Board is to bring this item back with the proposed language in Ordinance form.

d. Discussion and Possible Action on Proposal for Engineering Services, Village Bridge Deck Surface Treatments

Director Naze stated it was recommended to have a polymer overlay to extend the life of bridge decks. Ayres quoted a total cost of \$15,800. This amount is in the Capital Improvement Projects and the funds would be paid out of the Capital Project Fund.

Trustee Hill moved, seconded by Trustee Grabowski to Approve the Proposal for Engineering Services in the Amount not to Exceed \$15,800 for Bridge Desk Surface Treatments.
Motion carried 7-0.

a. Alcohol License

1. Possible Action on Agent Change at Pick-n-Save

Trustee Grabowski moved, seconded by Trustee Rohde, to Approve Craig Petersburs as the New Agent for Mega Marts, LLC Located at 1405 Capitol Drive.
Motion carried 7-0.

Motion carried 7-0.

b. Possible Action on Proposal Related to 460 Park Avenue Regarding Property Maintenance
Trustee Roberts moved, seconded by Trustee Grabowski to Engage in an Agreement with Facility Services Group to Clean the Yard, Remove Hazardous Materials from the Property, and Secure the Doors and Windows.
Motion carried 7-0.

Trustee Hill moved, seconded by Trustee Krasovich to adjourn the April 5, 2023, Regular Village Board meeting at approximately 7:57 p.m.

The action requested of the Village Board is to consider adoption of Ordinance No. 2023-04, Ordinance to Amend Chapter 14, Article VI, Section 14.243 of the Village of Pewaukee Code of Ordinances Regarding Demolition of Buildings.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-04**Ordinance to Amend Chapter 14, Article VI, Section 14.243 of the Village of Pewaukee Code of Ordinances Regarding Demolition of Buildings**

SECTION I

WHEREAS the Village Board of the Village of Pewaukee desires to clarify requirements for the issuance of demolition and raze permits for buildings or structures proposed to be demolished or razed.

SECTION II

NOW, THEREFORE, the Village Board does hereby ordain to amend create Section 14.243, Demolition of Buildings, to read as follows:

Sec. 14.243. Demolition of buildings.

Before a building can be demolished or removed, the owner or agent shall notify all utilities having service connections within the building such as water, electricity, gas, sewer and other connections and those connections shall be capped and terminated in accordance with the rules of the respective utilities. ~~In addition;~~addition, all hazardous and environmentally sensitive materials must be removed, contained and/or properly disposed of per current US EPA and WI DNR regulations with proper documentation submitted to Building Inspection Services evidencing that the materials have been removed and appropriately disposed of. ~~This includes and is not limited to; asbestos, lead based paint, fluorescent light bulbs, ballasts, oil, refrigerant.~~ A permit to demolish or to remove a building shall not be issued until it is ascertained that service connections and appurtenant equipment, such as meters and regulators, have been removed or sealed and plugged in a safe manner. Excavations shall be filled with solid fill to match lot grade, within 30 days of removal of the structure. Any excavation shall be protected with appropriate fences, barriers and/or lights. Before the demolition of a landmark, landmark site or improvement within an historic district the applicant must comply with Section 40.482 of the Village Code of Ordinances.

SECTION III

All ordinances or parts of ordinances contravening the terms and conditions of this ordinance are hereby to that extent repealed.

SECTION IV

The several sections of this ordinance shall be considered severable. If any section shall be considered by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the other portions of the ordinance.

SECTION V

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication or posting as approved by law, and the Village Clerk shall so amend the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Pewaukee, and shall indicate the date and number of this amending ordinance therein.

Re: Agenda Item 8b, Discussion, Direction, and/or Possible Action on Newsletter Delivery Options

BACKGROUND

On March 7th the Village Board gave direction to continue to seek options available to push out information to residents. In brainstorming the different ways to feed information to residents we began to research newsletter options which lead to a few different options such as thinking “big picture” to have a solution that will be long-lasting.

Demographics

Regarding the Village’s demographics it was discovered that 21% of Village residents are under 18 years and 23% of residents are over 65 years. This would determine that roughly 75% of our residents are probably familiar with texting, emailing, and apps. I have been working with Positively Pewaukee and Trustee Krasovich to get advice on different options.

Analytics

Attached you will see a chart that shows the unique page views for 2022. Unique pageviews combine the pageviews that are from the same person, on the same page, in the same session, and just count them as one. Unique pageviews are tracked for each page URL and page title combination. A user could view the same page 15 times, and refresh it multiple times as well—but if all of the views come in one session, it only counts as one unique pageview. This is helpful to view what residents are searching for on the website. The most searched item was the recycling center in 2022 which is 361 clicks on average per month.

NEWSLETTER OPTIONS

Constant Contact - Newsletter

The quote includes a setup to create and push out Important Info/Reminders to subscribers. This would be helpful for certain Village events such as elections, hydrant flushing, yard waste hours, etc. The annual cost of the newsletter program is driven by the number of subscribers (shown below), therefore as the subscriber lists continue to grow so does the cost. The library subscribed to this service in the past but many emails ended up in spam mailboxes. Prices are related to the number of subscribers.

The ability to place the newsletter on our website requires an upgraded subscription of \$5.00 per month or an extra \$60 per year. The estimated cost for the first year is roughly \$425 - \$1,320. \$10-\$80 per month with up to 10,000 subscribers.

TEXT MESSAGE OPTION

American Marketing & Publishing

Text messages may be used to reach a larger audience; most people young and old use cell phones and are familiar with texting. The vision for utilizing text messages would be to push out important information and notifications to residents. AMP has this option which enables a link to be embedded in the text message to direct the reader to that area on our website. Text messages have an average of 99% open/read rate. The cost is \$1,395 per year which gives us 150,000 text messages per year. After the 150,000 messages have been used the cost is \$0.015 per message. Each message means each message to each subscriber. If we had 5,000 subscribers' staff could send out 30 messages per year. Currently, we estimate we would send 14-18 messages at minimum, per year; 6 messages for DPW Important dates, 4-8 per year for elections, and 4 for a quarterly newsletter. The list of possibilities will grow with time. Once a subscriber decides to sign up they take a picture of a QR code or text a number. The company then sends a text with a link to the terms of use. In the terms, we would indicate the average number of text messages they may receive in a year while also including that if they sign up they may incur text charges.

COMBINATION OPTIONS

GoGov

Combining phone notifications/alerts and sending emails is an option with GoGov. This service would allow multiple means of communication. The subscriber would download a Village of Pewaukee-created app on their phone. The app, once opened, would contain information on frequently asked questions. The Village staff can send out a notification on the app and email subscribers. This service **doesn't** have a maximum number of messages in a month or year. The cost is \$3,900 per year. CivicPlus

Integrated into our website, CivicPlus has a product that allows subscribers to sign up to receive emails and/or text message alerts which can also be sorted based on categories. The [City of Oconomowoc](#) utilizes this notification system through its website provider CivicPlus. Non-subscribers are able to view past notifications by category on the website. The admin portal allows staff to check the delivery, blocked, and opened messages. The initial setup which includes training costs \$938 (one-time fee). The annual fee is \$1,995 which includes unlimited emails and up to 500 text messages per month. To purchase additional text messages the cost is \$945 per 500 (purchased in blocks of 500). As subscribers continue to grow so will the price.

Sendinblue

This marketing platform is where you are able to track delivery rates, spam rates, and open rates with high detail. This platform sends emails and text messages to subscribers from an online site. This option

seems to be more geared for marketing, but you may [view the demo online](#). The cost is \$65 per month (\$780 annually) which allows us to send 20,000 emails per month and texting cost \$1.90 per 100 texts.

Page Freezer & Archive Social

Page Freezer and Archive Social are two Companies that archive and preserve media accounts which would allow the Village to satisfy the necessary requirements of the state’s open records law and would allow searching to satisfy open record requests. These services cost roughly \$1,200 per year plus a one-time training fee of \$250 for Page Freezer and \$4,200 per year fee for Archive Social. This solution would allow staff to utilize Facebook to present information to subscribers with the hope of reaching a majority of residents. Staff could place an embedded Facebook feed on our website for a cost of \$5-\$10 per month. There are two options for embedding Facebook; to view the options click the links below. 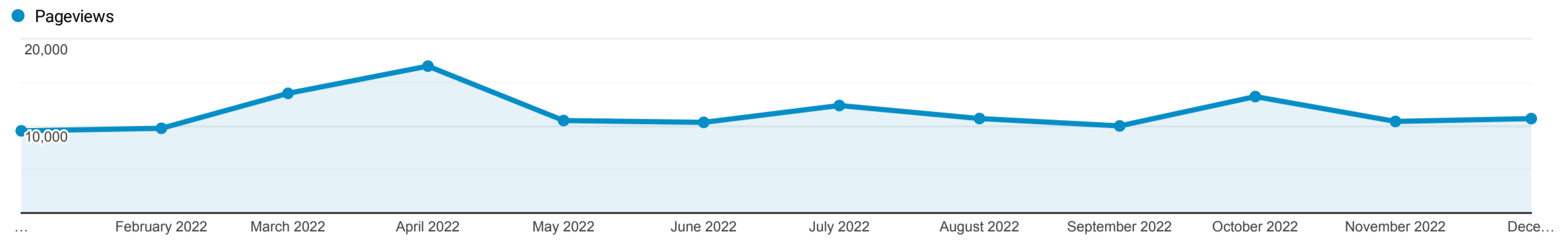



BACKGROUND

This matter is on the agenda at the request of Village President Knutson. Attached for your review, information and background on the Quiet Zone process is a copy of “Guide to the Quiet Zone Establishment Process” published by the Federal Railroad Administration. Earlier this year President Knutson reached out to the Office of the Commission of Railroads regarding whether it would be possible to pursue quiet zones at the Kopmeier Drive and Forest Grove Drive crossings understanding the work is needed to finalize the Oakton Avenue sealed corridor work. The OCR forwarded the request to the FRA as the OCR advised that it does not have jurisdiction over Quiet Zones. Below is an excerpt from the FRA response on the Village President’s inquiry.

ACTION REQUESTED

The action requested of the Village Board is to review the information to be discussed by the Village President on this matter and to provide direction on how to proceed.

ANALYSIS

The following is an excerpt from an email President Knutson received from Mr. Tom Domres, Railroad Crossing Inspector, Federal Railroad Administration:

“As to the question about establishing new Quiet Zones on the ends of the corridor, the answer to this question is: it depends. Here is what I mean:

You cannot skip crossings when you create a Quiet Zone. 49 CFR 222 requires that “a quiet zone may only contain consecutive public highway rail crossings located on a segment of a rail line.” Therefore, Forest Grove Drive and Kopmeier Drive cannot be in the same Quiet Zone until the projects at Wisconsin Avenue and Oakton Avenue are complete. Forest Grove Drive would need to be a stand-alone Quiet Zone, and Kopmeier Drive would need to be a separate stand-alone Quiet Zone.

Would these two crossings qualify as a stand-alone New Quiet Zone? It appears that the Village could move forward with a New Quiet Zone at these locations based on the following:

- The crossings are spaced far enough apart to meet the ½ mile requirements of 49 CRR 222.
- The crossings are being upgraded (or have been upgraded) with Constant Warning Time (CWT) that is required in 49 CFR 222.
- 4 Quadrant Gates are a Supplemental Safety Measure
- Flashing Lights and Gates with Medians are a Supplemental Safety Measure

The Village should consider how to tie the full Quiet Zone together once the Wisconsin Avenue and Oakton Avenue projects are complete. For this to comply with the Regulation, the Village would need to establish a New Quiet at all four crossings. Once in place, the Village would then terminate the single crossing stand-alone Quiet Zones at Forest Grove Drive and Kopmeier Drive. Documents would need to be very clear as to what is the Active Quiet Zone and what is the Terminated Quiet Zone. You don't want to terminate the 4 Crossing Quiet Zone by mistake!

Long story short: it is a little complicated and takes some paperwork. This is not something we see communities doing as most wait until all crossings are ready to establish a New Quiet Zone, but it can be done.”

Purpose of the Guide

This brochure was developed to serve as a guide for local decision makers seeking a greater understanding of train horn sounding requirements and how to establish quiet zones. Its purpose is to provide a general overview and thus does not contain every detail about the quiet zone establishment process. For more detailed and authoritative information, the reader is encouraged to review the official regulations governing the use of locomotive horns at public highway-rail grade crossings and the establishment of quiet zones that are contained in 49 CFR Part 222. About Quiet Zones



FRA is committed to reducing the number of collisions at highway-rail grade crossings, while establishing a consistent standard for communities who opt to preserve or enhance quality of life for their residents by establishing quiet zones within which routine use of train horns at crossings is prohibited.

Federal regulation requires that locomotive horns begin sounding 15–20 seconds before entering public highway-rail grade crossings, no more than one-quarter mile in advance. Only a public authority, the governmental entity responsible for traffic control or law enforcement at the crossings, is permitted to create quiet zones.

A quiet zone is a section of a rail line at least one-half mile in length that contains one or more consecutive public highway-rail grade crossings at which locomotive horns are not routinely sounded when trains are approaching the crossings. The prohibited use of train horns at quiet zones only applies to trains when approaching and entering crossings and does not include train horn use within passenger stations or rail yards. Train horns may be sounded in emergency situations or to comply with other railroad or FRA rules even within a quiet zone. Quiet zone regulations also do not eliminate the use of locomotive bells at crossings. Therefore, a more appropriate description of a designated quiet zone would be a “reduced train horn area.”

Communities wishing to establish quiet zones must work through the appropriate public authority that is responsible for traffic control or law enforcement at the crossings.

Historical Context

Historically, railroads have sounded locomotive horns or whistles in advance of grade crossings and under other circumstances as a universal safety precaution. Some States allowed local communities to create whistle bans where the train horn was not routinely sounded. In other States, communities created whistle bans through informal agreements with railroads.

In the late 1980's, FRA observed a significant increase in nighttime train-vehicle collisions at certain gated highway-rail grade crossings on the Florida East Coast Railway (FEC) at which nighttime whistle bans had been established in accordance with State statute. In 1991, FRA issued Emergency Order #15 requiring trains on the FEC to sound their horns again. The number and rate of collisions at affected crossings returned to pre-whistle ban levels.



In 1994, Congress enacted a law that required FRA to issue a Federal regulation requiring the sounding of locomotive horns at public highway-rail grade crossings. It also gave FRA the ability to provide for exceptions to that requirement by allowing communities under some circumstances to establish "quiet zones."

The Train Horn Rule became effective on June 24, 2005. The rule set nationwide standards for the sounding of train horns at public highway-rail grade crossings. This rule changed the criteria for sounding the horn from distance-based to time-based. It also set limits on the volume of a train horn. The rule also established a process for communities to obtain relief from the routine sounding of train horns by providing criteria for the establishment of quiet zones. Locomotive horns may still be used in the case of an emergency and to comply with Federal regulations or certain railroad rules.

Because the absence of routine horn sounding increases the risk of a crossing collision, a public authority that desires to establish a quiet zone usually will be required to mitigate this additional risk. At a minimum, each public highway–rail crossing within a quiet zone must be equipped with active warning devices: flashing lights, gates, constant warning time devices (except in rare circumstances) and power out indicators.

In order to create a quiet zone, one of the following conditions must be met

1. ***The Quiet Zone Risk Index (QZRI) is less than or equal to the Nationwide Significant Risk Threshold (NSRT)*** with or without additional safety measures such as Supplementary Safety Measures (SSMs) or Alternative Safety Measures (ASMs) described below. The QZRI is the average risk for all public highway-rail crossings in the quiet zone, including the additional risk for absence of train horns and any reduction in risk due to the risk mitigation measures. The NSRT is the level of risk calculated annually by averaging the risk at all of the Nation’s public highway-rail grade crossings equipped with flashing lights and gates where train horns are routinely sounded.
2. ***The Quiet Zone Risk Index (QZRI) is less than or equal to the Risk Index With Horns (RIWH)*** with additional safety measures such as SSMs or ASMs. The RIWH is the average risk for all public highway-rail crossings in the proposed quiet zone when locomotive horns are routinely sounded.
3. ***Install SSMs at every public highway-rail crossing.*** This is the best method to reduce to reduce risks in a proposed quiet zone and to enhance safety.





SSMs are pre-approved risk reduction engineering treatments installed at certain public highway-rail crossings within the quiet zone and can help maximize safety benefits and minimize risk. SSMs include: medians or channelization devices, one-way streets with gates, four quadrant gate systems, and temporary or permanent crossing closures. Examples of SSMs are shown on the next page.

ASMs are safety systems, other than SSMs, that are used to reduce risk in a quiet zone. ASMs typically are improvements that do not fully meet the requirements to be SSMs and their risk reduction effectiveness must be submitted in writing and approved by FRA.

FRA strongly recommends that all crossings in the quiet zone be reviewed by a diagnostic team. A diagnostic team typically consists of representatives from the public authority, railroad, and State agency responsible for crossing safety and FRA grade crossing managers.

Wayside Horns The train horn rule also provides another method for reducing the impact of routine locomotive horn sounding when trains approach public highway-rail grade crossings. A wayside horn may be installed at highway-rail grade crossings that have flashing lights, gates, constant warning time devices (except in rare circumstances), and power out indicators. The wayside horn is positioned at the crossing and will sound when the warning devices are activated. The sound is directed down the roadway, which greatly reduces the noise footprint of the audible warning. Use of wayside horns is not the same as establishing a quiet zone although they may be used within quiet zones.

Cost Considerations

The enabling Federal statute did not provide funding for the establishment of quiet zones. Public authorities seeking to establish quiet zones should be prepared to finance the installation of SSMs and ASMs used. Costs can vary from \$30,000 per crossing to more than \$1 million depending on the number of crossings and the types of safety improvements required.

Legal Considerations

The courts will ultimately determine who will be held liable if a collision occurs at a grade crossing located within a quiet zone, based upon the facts of each case, as a collision may have been caused by factors other than the absence of an audible warning. FRA’s rule is intended to remove failure to sound the horn as a cause of action in lawsuits involving collisions that have occurred at grade crossings within duly established quiet zones.

The Quiet Zone Establishment Process

Under the Train Horn Rule, only public authorities are permitted to establish quiet zones. Citizens who wish to have a quiet zone in their neighborhood should contact their local government to pursue the establishment of a quiet zone. The following is a typical example of the steps taken to establish a quiet zone:

1. **Determine** which crossings will be included in the quiet zone. All public highway-rail crossings in the quiet zone must have, at a minimum, an automatic warning system consisting of flashing lights and gates. The warning systems must be equipped with constant warning time devices (except in rare circumstances) and power out indicators. The length of the quiet zone must be at least one-half mile in length.
2. **Identify** any private highway-rail grade crossings within the proposed quiet zone. If they allow access to the public or provide access to active industrial or commercial sites, a diagnostic review must be conducted and the crossing(s) treated in accordance with the recommendations of the diagnostic team.
3. **Identify** any pedestrian crossings within the proposed quiet zone and conduct a diagnostic review of those crossings too. They also must be treated in accordance with the diagnostic team's recommendations. *NOTE:* While it is not required by the regulations, FRA recommends that every crossing within a proposed quiet zone be reviewed for safety concerns.
4. **Update** the U.S. DOT Crossing Inventory Form to reflect current physical and operating conditions at each public, private, and pedestrian crossing located within a proposed quiet zone.
5. **Provide** a Notice of Intent (NOI) to all of the railroads that operate over crossings in the proposed quiet zone, the State agency responsible for highway safety and the State agency responsible for crossing safety. The NOI must list all of the crossings in the proposed quiet zone and give a brief explanation of the tentative plans for implementing improvements within the quiet zone. Additional required elements of the NOI can be found in 49 CFR 222.43(b). The railroads and State agencies have 60 days in which to provide comments to the public authority on the proposed plan.
6. **Alternative Safety Measures** – If ASMs are going to be used to reduce risk, an application to FRA must be made. The application must include all of the elements provided in 49 CFR 222.39(b)(1) and copies of the application must be sent to the entities listed in 49 CFR 222.39(b)(3). They will have 60 days to provide comments to FRA on the application. FRA will provide a written decision on the application typically within three to four months after it is received.

The Quiet Zone Establishment Process continued

7. **Determine** how the quiet zone will be established using one of the following criteria: (Note that Options 2 through 4 will require the use of the FRA Quiet Zone Calculator available at <http://safetydata.fra.dot.gov/quiet/>.)

1. Every public highway-rail crossing in the proposed quiet zone is equipped with one or more SSMs.
2. The Quiet Zone Risk Index (QZRI) of the proposed quiet zone is less than or equal to the Nationwide Significant Risk Threshold (NSRT) without installing SSMs or ASMs.
3. The QZRI of the proposed quiet zone is less than or equal to the Nationwide Significant Risk Threshold (NSRT) after the installation of SSMs or ASMs.
4. The QZRI of the proposed quiet zone is less than or equal to the Risk Index with Horns (RIWH) after the installation of SSMs or ASMs.



8. **Complete** the installation of SSMs and ASMs and any other required improvements determined by the diagnostic team at all public, private, and pedestrian crossings within the proposed quiet zone.

9. **Ensure** that the required signage at each public, private, and pedestrian crossing is installed in accordance with 49 CFR Sections 222.25, 222.27, and 222.35, and the standards outlined in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. These signs may need to be covered until the quiet zone is in effect.

10. **Establish** the quiet zone by providing a Notice of Quiet Zone Establishment to all of the parties that are listed in 49 CFR Section 222.43(a)(3). Be sure to include all of the required contents in the notice as listed in 49 CFR Section 222.43(d). The quiet zone can take effect no earlier than 21 days after the date on which the Notice of Quiet Zone Establishment is mailed.

*****Appendix C to the Train Horn Rule provides detailed, step by step guidance on how to create a quiet zone.*****

Required Documentation

Public authorities interested in establishing a quiet zone are required to submit certain documentation during the establishment process. FRA has provided checklists for the various documents that can be found at <http://www.fra.dot.gov/Elib/Details/L03055>.

FRA's Regional Grade Crossing Managers are available to provide technical assistance. A State's department of transportation or rail regulatory agency also may be able to provide assistance to communities pursuing quiet zones.

Public authorities are encouraged to consult with the agencies in their State that have responsibility for crossing safety. Some States may have additional administrative or legal requirements that must be met in order to modify a public highway-rail grade crossing.

Role of Railroads

Communities seeking to establish a quiet zone are required to send a Notice of Intent and a Notice of Quiet Zone Establishment to railroads operating over the public highway-rail grade crossings within the proposed quiet zone. Railroad officials can provide valuable input during the quiet zone establishment process and should be included on all diagnostic teams. Listed below are links to the Class I Railroads and Amtrak.

FINAL NOTE

The information contained in this brochure is provided as general guidance related to the Quiet Zone Establishment Process and should not be considered as a definitive resource. FRA strongly recommends that any public authority desiring to establish quiet zones take the opportunity to review all aspects of safety along its rail corridor. Particular attention should be given to measures that prevent trespassing on railroad tracks since investments made to establish a quiet zone may be negated if the horn has to be routinely sounded to warn trespassers.

BACKGROUND

As the Village Board may be aware, one of the outstanding items as it relates to finalizing the sealed corridor project for the Oakton Avenue crossing proposing a permanent solution for the “no left turn” requirement put forth by the Office of the Commissioner of Railroads (OCR) for this crossing. Staff from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation have proposed a solution for Village consideration and staff is bringing this concept forward for Village Board consideration and direction.

ACTION REQUESTED

The action requested of the Village Board is to review and provide direction on how it desires to proceed on this matter.

ANALYSIS

The Village Board is aware of the current delineation to deter left turns onto Clark Street and Capitol Drive. WisDOT staff is proposed consideration of a solution called Kwik Curb (copy of informational brochure attached) as a permanent delineating solution and is seeking input from the Village if this would be acceptable to proceed with proposing to the OCR. WisDOT advises that they would need to the Village to consent to administering the construction of this system as well as the Village agreeing to be responsible for the maintenance of the system long-term. It is my understanding that WisDOT would enter into an agreement with the Village to reimburse the Village for the cost and installation of the system through the WisDOT Railway-Highway Crossing Safety Program.

If the Village Board were amenable to the aforementioned items, WisDOT would seek OCR’s determination that the system would fit their requirements for a permanent installation.

BACKGROUND

This is a project that was reviewed during the 2023 budget discussions and was also presented as a possible use of ARPA funds. Park & Recreation Director Nick Phalin reached out to a local plumbing company for a proposal to install a grinder pump and directional bore a new discharge line from the Village Park pavilion 400 feet to the east to connect to the sanitary sewer main in Caldwell Street. The proposal came in significantly higher than the state bidding threshold amount of \$25,000 which requires the Village to publicly bid this project. The proposed agreement with raSmith would provide for raSmith preparing a design and bid document for the installation of a grinder pump and lateral.

This project is necessary as the current lateral has a minimum pitch from the building to the sanitary sewer main in Caldwell Street which has caused backups in the bathrooms as well as the need for getting the lateral as preventive measures.

ACTION REQUESTED

The action requested of the Village Board is to consider approval of the proposed agreement with raSmith regarding the Kiwanis Village Park sanitary sewer lateral design and bid document.

ANALYSIS

The proposal is on a time and expense basis with an estimated fee of \$6,000. The funding for the engineering agreement as well as the construction related work can come from the Village's Infrastructure Fund which is preliminarily projected to have an estimated balance of \$1,200,000 as of 12/31/2022 (pending final audit).
