Dear Resident/Property Owner:

RE: Project Start – Glacier Road Utility and Street Reconstruction Project

This letter is to notify you that the Glacier Road project will begin the week of April 20 to April 24. Glacier Road will be reconstructed as part of the Village's 2026 Street Program. The Glacier Road project will take place from W. Wisconsin Avenue to the west for 1,160 feet to the Village limits. The work is planned to be completed by end of July, 2026. The Contractor for this project is DF Tomasini Contractors, Inc.

Along Glacier Road, the work includes relay of the water main and water services, relay of storm sewer culverts, ditch grading, spot concrete curb and gutter removal and replacement, ADA sidewalk ramp removal and replacement, pavement removal and replacement, pavement striping, and sanitary sewer lining.

Later in the summer, the remainder of W. Wisconsin Avenue, is planned to be repaved from Burroughs Drive to Glacier Road as part of a separate project.

Updates will be placed onto the project's webpage on the Village of Pewaukee Website: <https://www.villageofpewaukee.com/home>. During the project, a construction inspector will be onsite to observe construction. You may contact this inspector if you have comments, questions, or concerns with the project.

Parking and Access

Before actual construction starts, the Contractor will be issuing a notice 24-hours in advance to properties along the construction work. After that notice, the utility and street work will begin. Traffic will attempt to be maintained as much as possible during the construction. There may be intermittent times when no access will be allowed depending on what work is being completed. Please observe "No Parking" signs to assist the Contractor in getting the work completed.

During the project, local traffic from within the construction zone will have access to their driveways. If your property has a driveway culvert, there will be temporarily no access across your driveway while the culvert is being removed and replaced, or if street or pipe work is being completed immediately in front of your driveway. This Glacier Road project is planned to include a Detour Plan to route traffic from outside the construction zone around the project to attempt to minimize traffic so the contractor can more efficiently complete the work. The Detour Plan is subject to being continually agreeable to the City of Pewaukee and Waukesha County.

Mail Delivery

Due to excavation for road construction, some homes will have their mailboxes moved to a temporary and nearby cluster location along Glacier Road. Residents whose mailboxes are moved will need to pick up their mail at the temporary location in front of 769 Glacier Road until the mailboxes are moved back.

Water main and water service replacement

The 1966 6-inch cast iron water main will be relayed as an 8-inch PVC main. The water services to each house will be relayed to the curb stop valve which is near the property line. The contractor and inspector will coordinate with property owners with more advanced notices regarding short term planned water outages to businesses and residential homes needed for water main cross over connections and water service replacements. During construction, unplanned events can occur such as water main breaks, damaged pipes, or unexpected discovery of non-operating water valves which can cause unplanned water outages.

Garbage and Recycling

During the street reconstruction, Garbage and Recycling collection will continue on the same day that it is usually collected. Your carts may need to be moved to the end of the street if the garbage truck driver determines he or she cannot drive through the construction project.

Street Reconstruction

The existing street width will remain the same. Driveway culverts will be replaced as needed to improve ditch drainage. On the east end, the plan is to preserve as much concrete curb and gutter as possible. The Contractor will attempt to not disturb fences or retaining walls that are located adjacent to the right of way line. If you have any plantings or landscaping that you want to preemptively re-plant please have them removed before the construction begins. Also, you may trim any limbs or bushes that overhang the street. The Contractor will not be responsible for broken branches that overhang into the street.

Please do not drive on the new pavement until the barricades have been removed from the entrances. The new street will be opened as soon as possible. Driveway approaches will be replaced in kind. Residents will be given notice prior to their driveway being removed and replaced. Concrete driveway approaches will require a one-week cure time. During that time, residents will not be able to traverse the newly poured concrete driveway approach. After the street is open, there may be seeding and miscellaneous work to finish. The schedule of this project will depend greatly upon the weather.

Sanitary Sewer Main Lining

The existing 8-inch clay sanitary sewer main will be lined.

School Bus Pick Up and Drop Off

The busing schedules will be affected. The bus company and School will send notifications regarding where and when the school buses will pick up and drop off kids.

Street and utility reconstruction is a major undertaking. We appreciate your tolerance to the noise, dust, dirt, mud, temporary water outages, and the overall inconvenience of reconstruction.

If you are a business owner with employees or customers, property manager or landlord and your property is rented to tenants, please pass along the applicable information from this letter to your employees, customers, or tenants as soon as possible. If you have any planned projects, or deliveries, please take into consideration the upcoming project.
