

**VILLAGE OF PEWAUKEE
REGULAR VILLAGE BOARD MINUTES
AUGUST 4, 2026**

1. Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, Moment of Silence, and Roll Call

President Knutson called the meeting to order at approximately 6:06 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited, followed by a moment of silence.

Roll Call was taken with the following Village Board members present: Trustee Nick Stauff, Trustee Bob Rohde, Trustee Rachel Pader, Trustee Kristen Kreuser, Trustee Jim Grabowski; and President Jeff Knutson.

Excused: Trustee Kelli Belt.

Also Present: Village Attorney, Matt Gralinski; Village Administrator, Matt Heiser; Village Clerk, Mackenzie Quigley; Deputy Clerk, Jessica Sweet.

2. Public Hearings/Presentations

a. Announcement Regarding Village Hall Front Counter Closure on August 24, 2026.

Heiser shared that he intends to follow a similar approach as last year by closing the office for approximately 90 minutes for team bonding.

3. Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting

a. Minutes from the July 21, 2026, Special Village Board Meeting.

Trustee Pader moved, seconded by Trustee Kreuser to approve the July 21, 2026, minutes of the Special Village Board meeting as presented.

Motion carried 6-0.

b. Minutes from the July 21, 2026, Regular Village Board Meeting.

Trustee Rohde moved, seconded by Trustee Pader to approve July 21, 2026, minutes of the Regular Village Board meeting as presented.

Motion carried 6-0.

4. Citizen Comments

Colleen Boland, 253 Park Avenue, expressed concerns regarding the clarity and interpretation of the Village ordinances.

8. New Business

- a. Review, discussion and possible action regarding draft utility and street design drawings for 2027 Prospect Avenue project from Main Street to School Street including possible addition of new sidewalk.**

Grabowski, on behalf of the Public Works & Safety Committee, provided an update from the August 4, 2026, meeting. The committee recommended not moving forward with sidewalk installation for the majority of properties along Prospect; however, a sidewalk extension could be added to serve the two properties whose owners expressed support for the improvement.

Discussion followed regarding the overall benefits of the project relative to its potential costs, the continued extension of sidewalks along the roadway as budget availability and water main repairs permit, and improvements to crosswalk signage and safety measures.

Trustee Grabowski moved, seconded by Trustee Rohde to approve the draft utility and street design drawings for 2027 Prospect Avenue project from Main Street to School Street with the elimination of the new sidewalk. Motion carried 6-0.

b. Review, discussion and possible action to award the construction contract to Wolf Paving, Inc. for the 2026 West Wisconsin Street project from Burroughs Drive to Glacier Road.

Knutson asked whether this is the same company that completed the W Wisconsin project last year, noting that concerns had been raised regarding the quality of the completed work.

Director Buechl clarified that the company under consideration is different from the contractor that performed the W Wisconsin project last year.

Trustee Grabowski moved, seconded by Trustee Kreuser to award the construction contract for the 2026 West Wisconsin Street project to Wolf Paving, Inc.

Motion carried 6-0.

c. Review, discussion and possible action to approve a design proposal from RA Smith for the 2027 street project on West Wisconsin from Glacier Road to Village limits.

Trustee Grabowski moved, seconded by Trustee Pader to approve a design proposal from RA Smith for the 2027 street project on West Wisconsin from Glacier Road to Village limits.

Motion carried 6-0.

d. Review, discussion and possible action to approve a design proposal from RA Smtih for the 2027 street project on Richmond Drive.

Grabowski noted that the project timeline was accelerated due to issues identified with the water main.

Trustee Grabowski moved, seconded by Trustee Rohde to approve the design proposal from RA Smtih for the 2027 Richmond Drive street project.

Motion carried 6-0.

e. Review, discussion and possible action to extend the special events permit for Waterfront Wednesdays and sales of alcohol at Lakefront Park to include August 12 and August 19.

The Board clarified that August 12, and August 19 are Wednesdays. The date values shown in the report are accurate; the clarification pertained only to the corresponding day of the week.

Trustee Grabowski moved, seconded by Trustee Kreuser to approve the special events permit for Waterfront Wednesdays and sales of alcohol at Lakefront Park to include August 12 and August 19.

Motion carried 6-0.

f. Review, discussion and possible action on an update on the Quiet Zone project.

Heiser provided an update on the Quiet Zone project, noting that the City of Pewaukee is willing to collaborate with the Village on a temporary joint Quiet Zone filing. This approach could accelerate the establishment of the Quiet Zone; however, the Village would still be required to complete an Alternative Safety Review, which may take up to two years to complete after submission.
